


Empowering Dental Students: Experiential Learning Initiatives in Hong Kong and Africa

Background

Dental training in the teaching hospital may not fully prepare students for future clinical practice

- Working with screened patients
- Global competence is often overlooked in dental education due to the limited patient diversity

Experiential learning in dental education offers valuable

- Practical exposure in diverse outreach settings
- Apply theoretical knowledge in real-life scenarios
- Transition from the classroom to real-world clinical settings
- Reflect on outreach experiences based on existing knowledge
- Refine their understanding
- Encourage experimentation with new concepts

Aims

Engage students in

- Developing practical skills and insights
- Consolidating and extending concepts through exposure to diverse outreach experiences
- Creatively promoting oral health promotion
- Conducting dental treatments in compromised settings
- Developing problem-solving skills in addressing challenges, by proactively responding to unexpected settings and making informed decisions in novel situations
- Enhancing communication skills through collaboration with charitable organisations
- Upholding personal professional ethics and standards and providing optimal dental care in challenging settings by thorough preparation and research
- Cultivating a sense of global citizenship and leadership by advocating for oral health awareness

Local and Overseas Outreaches

Between Aug 2022 & Aug 2024

- 2 overseas projects in Togo and Tanzania respectively, for orphans and villagers in rural areas
- Several local dental outreach projects in Hong Kong for senior residents in Tai O, ethnic minority groups, grassroot families, etc.


Involved dental examinations, prophylactic treatment, simple scaling, atraumatic restorative techniques, etc. under the supervision of clinical tutors


Student engagements

- Projects were co-designed and implemented by students under guidance
- All students were given the chance to set up dental equipment, provide dental exam, education and treatment
- Students interacted with local people encountered during the trips, facilitating cultural exchange
- Social workers from collaborating partners organized useful debriefing sessions for participating dental students to reflect on their learning experiences

Experiential learning evaluation

- Focus group discussion
 - Calibrated interviewer from the HKU Faculty of Education
 - 5 BDS IV students interviewed
- Anonymous online evaluation questionnaire










